AP Test Registration Reminder

Students currently enrolled in an AP class will receive a registration form from their AP teacher with payment instructions. Please turn it in to the Guidance Office, along with payment in the form of a check, by **October 25th**. If you are enrolled in an AP class that begins second semester, such as AP Government, payment will be due at a later date. Any students looking to take an AP test who are not enrolled in the class, please stop by the Guidance Office and see Mr. Kabakjian.



Seniors: College Application Process

Mrs. Leaman visited the Senior English classes to review the application process and how to use SCOIR. She encourages seniors to see her directly for additional support. A few reminders: 1) Make sure you add the colleges you are applying to on SCOIR. 2) Invite your teachers through SCOIR to write letters of recommendation. 3) Your transcript will be sent through SCOIR to the colleges you apply to. AFTER YOU APPLY TO A COLLEGE, GO INTO SCOIR AND MOVE THAT COLLEGE TO "APPLIED". This will let us know to send out your letters of recommendation and transcript.

Juniors: Plan Your Education

While all four years in high school are important, the most pivotal year for academic and career decisions is a student's junior year. During their junior year, students take a more comprehensive look at their future beyond high school. Mr. Kabakjian will visit Juniors to review college and career information and familiarize them with SCOIR, a college planning system to assist in exploring careers and applying to colleges. Students and their parents are also invited to make an appointment to talk with Mr. Kabakjian about college and career options.

The easiest way to register for the SAT is online at www.Collegeboard.com. Students should set up an account with College Board. This will give them access to many tools that are available to support SAT preparation and the college search. There are also helps for parents. This is a recommended site for college bound students and their parents.

Testing Information

Juniors and Sophomores: The PSAT is scheduled for Wednesday, October 12. All juniors will report to their assigned locations by 7:45 a.m. to take this exam. Locations will be posted on Schoology the week before the test. Taking the PSAT is the first step in entering the scholarship programs conducted by the National Merit Scholarship Corporation. There is no charge for Juniors. PSAT informational booklets will be distributed when they become available.

The Guidance Office also invited sophomores to take the PSAT. Mrs. Leaman visited sophomore classes to give students more information. Sophomores do not qualify for scholarships, but it is good practice for their junior year.

Report Cards

Quarter One ends on **Thursday, November 3rd**, and report cards will be issued to students on **Friday, November 11th at the end of the school day**. A student's report card may be held for a variety of reasons such as overdue books, failure to return a sport uniform, etc. The teacher who holds the report card will issue it when the student has handled their responsibilities to them.
